CONNECTIONAL MINISTRIES!

We recently received our Church Budget Report from the Conference Office which included our monthly apportionment amounts for the coming year. The grand total is a little over \$19, 300 which is actually a slight decrease from 2019, as the EPA Conference has been trying to keep these costs as low as possible. It might sometimes seem like the money we send to the conference office in the form of Connectional Ministry Giving is an "unnecessary tax," but we need to remember that we are a Connectional Church. By combining resources and joining together with other United Methodist Churches we are able to accomplish more for the Kingdom of God than any of us would on our own.

Two examples: several years ago the ministry titled "Nothing but Nets" was begun by a member of the UMC. The goal was to provide mosquito nets to individuals living in areas prone to malaria. This ministry morphed into Imagine No Malaria as individuals and churches became involved and the scope widened to include other aspect of malaria prevention and treatment. Our church was included in this effort and the results are obvious as the infection rates have dropped sharply! God used our United Methodist Church to change the lives of those who suffering!! And when there is some type of natural disaster in our country or around the world, the United Methodist Council on Relief (UMCOR) is consistently one of the first

groups to arrive and begin providing and also one of the last groups to leave. I guess it is possible that we could this on our own but when we join together, more is done!

And the money we send to the conference tangibly represents our joining together with other United Methodist Churches. These payments are divided into 11 different categories. The largest single line items go to fund the pensions and health insurance for retired clergy, followed by our property, liability and worker's compensation insurance. There are also funds for the retirement fund, life and disability insurance for the current pastor. And then there are the funds that go to UMC missionaries (such as the Kies that we support separately) and other ministries around the world along with the budget for our district and conference.

And while we have been self-sufficient for a number of years, our church has in the past received connectional funds from the EPA Conference. Part of our witness to the world is the connected nature of the United Methodist Church. We all join together to minister to those in our neighborhoods and around the world.

Thank you all for making this possible!

And of course another aspect of being connected means that we are always praying for each other and for our denomination and sister churches around the world. May we all remain connected in prayer!

GENERAL CONFERENCE 2020

-Delegates from around the world will participate in the next General Conference of the United Methodist Church in Minneapolis on May 5-15, 2020. While they will have plenty of items to deal with, the spotlight will be on the issues regarding LGBTQ individuals within the church. I realize that the news reports sometimes make it sound like the United Methodist Church has undergone tremendous changes in the past few years but the truth is that the Book of Discipline has not changed since the original statement was included in 1972. In fact, at the special General Conference earlier this year, the plan that passed was the most conservative of all the proposals.

At the same time, there are many within the denomination that disagree about how the Bible passages that deal with LGBTQ activity should be interpreted. Because of this, some churches and conferences around the country have chosen not to enforce the sections of the book of discipline that say that the practice of homosexuality is incompatible with Christian teaching, that same sex marriages should not be performed and that practicing homosexuals are not to be ordained. As a denomination, we continue to wrestle with this issue and have attempted for many years to find a way to coexist.

Since this continues to be difficult, many believe that some type of a split is inevitable. Depending on what takes place at this General Conference in May, the process of splitting could commence or maybe another proposal would be approved that would ask each congregation to have an official vote to decided where they stand on this issue. Of course, we will see what happens

Please join us in prayer for our denomination and also for wisdom for our congregation as we move forward and continue to represent our Lord, Jesus Christ
